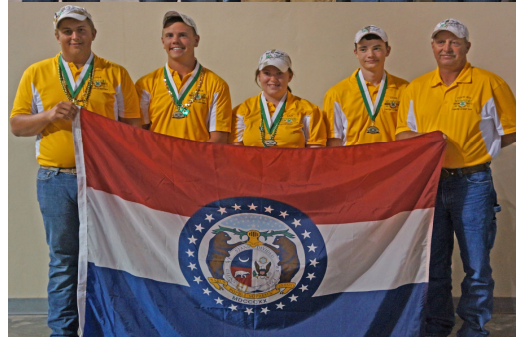

Missouri State 4-H Shooting Sports placed 2nd at the 2012 4H National Shooting Sports Invitational. Missouri state team was represented by 36 shooters and 9 coaches in disciplines of Compound Archery, Recurve Archery, Shotgun, 22 Rifle, 22 Pistol, Hunting Skills, Air Rifle, Air Pistol, and Muzzle Loading. The Invitational brought 32 states with 576 shooters together in Grand Island,

Nebraska, braving a variety of weather conditions of high winds, rain and heat, over the three-day competition.

The Recurve Archery team placed 4th and the Compound Archery team placed 6th, in 3-day competition consisting of the Field round, FITA round, and a 3-D round. The Recurve Archery team; Chase Wilson-Lewis

County, Emma Thompson-Boone County, Chyanne Davis-Boone County, and Jessica Brown-Boone County was coached by Jim Sappington-Boone County.

LARGE & SMALL GAME COMMITTEE

Let's continue our countdown of the MBH All Time Deer. This month will be the #4 & #3 Deer.

MBH All Time P&Y Typical Bucks'

The #4 buck was killed in 1989 by Vern Pemberton in St. Louis County. It scored 162&4/8 P&Y. Unfortunately I cannot find any more info on this buck. If anyone has any more info on Vern's buck kill please let me know?

The #3 buck is an 11 pt. typical killed by Brandon Beissenherz in Boone County on November 10, 2000 at 8:30am. Brandon is the second member of the Beissenherz family to make the top ten list. Bill Beissenherz took the #9 typical. Brandon used his Mathews Q2 bow with a Wasp Jack-Hammer broadhead from a tree stand at 22 yards to shoot that buck. The deer field dressed at 198lbs and scored 164&4/8 P&Y points.

MBH All Time P&Y Non-Typical Bucks'

The #4 buck was a 17 pointer killed by Bill McQuillen in St. Louis County on November 8, 1994 at 4:45pm. Bill shot it through the lungs from 15 yards with his Oregon bow and a Thunderhead 100 broadhead. That deer field dressed at 175lbs and scored 166&1/8 P&Y points. Four years earlier in 1990 Non-Typical Buck #3 was killed; it scored a whopping 188&4/8 P&Y. Ronnie Hopper used a PSE bow to harvest his 24 pointer. A Rocky Mountain broadhead on an aluminum arrow was the lethal combination on this deer, the date was October 25th at 6:15pm from 15yds away. Ronnie was hunting in St Louis County on private ground. That great buck tipped the scales at 190lbs field dressed.

MBH All Time Big Does'

The #4 Doe was taken in Clark County by Dennis Foglesong at 6:45am on November 9, 1975. The deer's field dress weight was 165lbs. That's all I can find about Dennis's deer.

The #3 Doe was killed by Frank Mueller in St. Genevieve County in 1991. Frank used a Hoyt bow with a Nap Thunderhead broadhead. The shot was 22 steps at 6:45am on November the 23rd. Field dressed weight was 167lbs. That's a couple of huge does! Wait till you see next months top 2.

At the July B of R meeting budget concerns were discussed which included the cost of the MBH Large Game Pins and the annual game awards given to MBH members for their success in the field. The bottom line is I have been given an annual budget to spend on Large Game Awards and the authority to provide the number & type of awards that I think would best benefit all of the MBH membership without exceeding my budgeted dollars. For this year I wanted to have an award that all of our members were eligible to earn so I have designed a **NEW** Large Game Pin that will be given to any MBH member that kills a deer, turkey, or predator (coyote, bobcat, or fox) in Missouri with their archery equipment and sends me a Large Game report. Yep that's right predators are now included in the Large Game Category. The report can be found and filled out on our web site at www.mobowhunters.org or give me a call and I can send you one. All MBH members are eligible to earn a pin for their first Large Game animal this year even if you have already earned the old MBH Large Game Pin. I have also designed new "adder pins" that are deer, turkey, or predator. Members can purchase these for \$5.00 each this year. For those members that still want the old "adder bars" I have very few left, so contact me if you want to purchase those. In addition to making changes to the Large Game Pins, modifications have also been made to the annual awards for this year. Winners will receive a certificate of achievement suitable for framing, a Bass Pro Shops \$25 gift card, and recognition in the MBH Release Newsletter.

MBH annual awards for 2012/13 season will be;

1st Fall Turkey- Be sure to record the date & time of the kill.

1st Deer- Be sure to record the date & time of the kill, we usually get more than one opening day kill.

Last Deer- again we usually get several reports near the end of season.

P&Y Typical Best Buck- Must have a copy of the score sheet from a qualified P&Y, B&C, or MABB scorer. Green score is acceptable. If you need help finding a qualified scorer, give me a call & I might be able to help.

P&Y Non-Typical Best Buck- same as above

Lucky Deer- At the start of the season an average field dressed weight is chosen at random by me. The member that harvests a deer at that weight or closest to it wins the Lucky Deer Award.

Grand Slam Award- If any MBH member fills their Archery Permit (2 deer & 2 Turkey) they will receive this award and one lucky Grand Slammer will be drawn to receive a \$25 BPS gift card.

There will be two bowfishing awards given this year. Since these are not available to enter on the web site just send it to me by mail or email or give me a call.

Big Fish Kill- biggest fish kill by weight (all legal species included).

Longest Gar Kill- measured in inches to the closest 1/4".

Deadline for all entries will be March 1, 2013.

I hope this will encourage you to submit your game reports and pictures this year. We all love to see those pictures and I am sure you are proud of your accomplishment as you should be.

By the way here is what the new game pins look like.

CONSERVATION COMMITTEE

The dog days of August are upon us and we are all wishing the weather would cool off! Even though the hot weather makes you want to stay indoors next to the air conditioner its time to start planting your fall food plots and scouting for those early season bucks. September 15th will be here before you know it. Planting food plots in August is a chore but you need to get that seed in the ground even though it's hot & dry. As fall approaches you want your seed to be ready and waiting for the cooler weather and the rain that we all hope is coming. If you wait until that weather arrives in mid-September its all ready too late to get a good stand of clover, brassicas, oats, or winter wheat. Most seed companies say the best planting time for Missouri is August 15th until October 1st. I have found that the 3rd week of August works the best for my fall food plots in Hickory County. By then the hot summer weather has started to moderate and my plots will get the full benefit any September rains plus have about eight weeks to grow before frost slows them down. I have had much better luck planting in the late summer than I do in the spring. It seems to me like the weather is less extreme, that is the temperature swing isn't as wild and rainfall amounts are less than in the spring so flooding of my creek side lowland plots doesn't occur.

A couple of good reasons for late summer planting are, less chance weather conditions will keep you from getting into the field with your tractor and young clover plants get the fall season plus the following spring season to get established before the scorching summer heat. It seems like every time I try to plant in the spring I get a good stand initially but by July my clover has dried up and blown away. August is also the best time of year to locate where those early season bucks are coming into the fields. You will want to do your scouting from long range with your binoculars so as not to disturb their pattern. By actually watching the deer you will know exactly where to hang your treestand for opening day. Those groups of bachelor bucks will hang out together using the same daily routine and food sources for about the first two weeks of the season. Around the first of October the bucks get a little friskier and start changing their pattern getting ready for the rut. Another excellent way to scout and access the bucks in your hunting area is to put up those trail cameras. By placing those cameras on known food sources you can see the number and size of the bucks using that food source. Once your cameras have been up for 4 or 5 days you should take a look at the pictures to see which fields that you need to be concentrating on to tag that early season buck.
