Mildred Irene "Millie" Foster, 79, of Kansas City, Mo passed away Wednesday October 20th, 2010 surrounded by family. She was born November 26, 1930 to Eugene and Mildred Furrow in Newark, NJ.

Survivors include her husband of 38 years, Earl; daughter, Sharon Henneman; 4 sons; Mark, Randy, Rick and John, 7 grandchildren; Tobi, Toni, Tyler, Haley, John, Steven and Talon, 3 great grandchildren; Brian, Samantha and Lauren and 2 great-great grandchildren; Abbygail and Landen.

Although she worked several jobs, I think it's safe to say she was best known for her participation and association with the sport of Archery in and around Kansas City and the state of Missouri. She was a State Women's Limited Champion several times, involved for many years in the leadership of the Missouri Bow Hunters and the local Independence Bow Hunters organizations starting in the 1970's. Millie was also a Midwest Sectional and National Champion in 1974.

Millie had a friend named Jerry Adams, who

found the Lord and became a Christian, a long time ago. I told her that I thought it would be a good idea for whichever one of us that got their first to wait at the gate and help the other one in. Millie said that sounded like a good idea. She told me she had accepted Jesus as her Savior. Then she looked at me, smiled and said, "If I get there first, what makes you think I'll let you in?" I praise the Lord that she was willing to accept Jesus as her Savior and that she will be waiting at the gate to help all of us that have accepted Jesus as our Savior to get in there with her.

When I started writing this I was overwhelmed with the amount of memories about Millie that kept popping up and I knew I had to find a way to collect and consolidate them into something that wouldn't be a huge book but rather a description of the things that made Millie, who and what she really was.

Millie was able to see problems and fix them. The very first time I met Millie, I was at the Archery range over on Prospect in 1968. I was shooting and hitting everything but the targets. I heard this woman saying, "Hey Mister, you don't know squat about shooting a bow, do you?" I turned towards her and she said "Hi, I'm Millie and I'm 6'2" of romping heck and I am gonna have to whip your hind end, if you don't learn how to shoot that thing without hurting someone." Before I could say anything, she got one of the guys off the line and brought him to where I was and told him to show me how to shoot. Just as quickly as she appeared, she disappeared and went back to whatever she was doing.

Tim's Venison Stew :

2-3 large red potatoes, cubed
2 cups sliced carrots
1 yellow sweet onion, cut into chunks
6 cups water
14 oz. can beef broth
3 beef bouillon cubes
1 table spoon of salt
3 heaping tablespoons of red currant jelly
1 cup of red wine, set 1/2 cup aside for later
1 1/2 lb. of venison cut into 2-inch cubes
Dash of Tony Chachere's Original Creole Seasoning
Black pepper to taste
3/4 cup Kentucky Kernel Seasoned Flour

A recipe received courtesy KY Department of Fish & Wildlife.

Pour all liquid ingredients into a slow cooker. Add the bouillon cubes, salt, Creole seasoning and black pepper, stirring until dissolved. Next, add the vegetables and venison. Set the slow cooler on low and cook 4-5 hours, until tender. A few minutes before serving, mix Seasoned Flour with 1/4 cup of water until dissolved. Pour into stew and cook until desired thickness results. This recipe feeds four average people or two hungry deer hunters. Oh and that 1/2 cup of wine, take a sip while making and checking on the recipe. Enjoy!

Bow Hunter Defense Committee

The third and final meeting with the Camdenton City Council was held on Oct. 28th with some interesting results. The council decided to have a managed hunt, that will take place hopfully after Christmas. The city will contact residents that want the deer thinned from their property. Some of the requirements, is that the hunter have completed the MDC Bow Hunter Education Course. Hunting will be from an elevated stand of at least 10' and the hunters MDC Heritage Card number must be on the arrows they intend to hunt with. Hunting will be limited to 3 acre tracts and larger.

A second type of hunt will be conducted through the county MDC conservation agent. If it is determined, by the agent that there is a nuisance problem with the deer, no matter what size of the property or if the archery season is over, qualified bow hunters will be called in to help with this problem. I will be working with the local agent on this matter to supply him names of qualified bow hunters. Camdenton City Hall telephone number is 573-346-3600. For those interested, please wait until after Christmas to make contact.

Funding from the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) combined with dollars from state and local sponsors have put a boost in the Share the Harvest Program (STH) Gov. Nixon announced that a portion of Missouri's ARRA funds has made additional monies available to increase the number of meat processors for STH. Last year, Mo. deer hunters collected a quarter million pounds of venison for needy families. With additional funds, more than one half million pounds of venison to be collected is possible for the upcoming deer season. Our county MDC agent (Camden) stated that the three STH meat lockers in our county alone, have funding to process thirty deer each at no cost to the hunter or the processor, due to the ARRA funding.

She started out at 70 yards out and then 40 minutes late came directly under my tree to sniff our tree trimmers! After looking at Joe and I for several




My name is Bill Myers and I am running for the office of Vice President of MBH.

I am from High Ridge, Mo and have been involved in archery since 1979. My passion for archery started out as a way to prolong deer season and I have been hooked ever since. I began competing in local tournaments (both field and animal)

and attended my first Missouri Bow Hunters (MBH) State Indoor Tournament in 1980. I have been a member of the NFAA and MBH for the past 30 years. I have served on the Board of Representatives for varies clubs since around 1985.

... Wherever Millie was, Earl was right there by her side and if he wasn't you heard, "EARL, EARL!!" and from across the room you heard... "WHAT !?" Millie was versatile. She was the only woman I know that could fletch a dozen arrows, talk on the phone and tell Earl he was putting that peep in wrong. Very good... wasn't she?





Millie was an organizer, project manager and supervisor. It takes a lot of planning within an organization to make it do what the members want it to do. One of the hardest things to do in Archery is to get an outdoor tournament up and running. I don't know how she figured out what had to be done, to make a tournament successful, but Millie could organize all the areas that were needed in her mind. How many times did we hear her say, "Ok guys, this tournament isn't going to get done by itself, we've got to get busy and get everything done before dark, RIGHT?" Then she would point to someone else and say, "You can take care of the shooting stakes, RIGHT?" Everyone involved would be appointed a task to complete until all the jobs were assigned and being worked. Millie would supervise all of the work and get involved also instead of just watching it get done. She would help out with each job until all the bales were stacked and banded, then she would go help someone cut branches in the shooting lanes, setup tables in the registration area, or whatever needed to be done.

Millie knew all about multi tasking before it became a subject to talk about. She would show

up at the range on tournament day with Tobi riding on one hip, while she carried bags of ice and cases of coke to the refreshment area. She was constantly on the move to keep things running smoothly. How many times did we see her come to a tournament with an arm in a sling, or a cast on one of her legs or see her on crutches and still planning to shoot?

I remember one time when we were at her house playing cards at the kitchen table. Without stopping the game, Millie began cooking dinner. She served it, we ate and she cleaned up after we ate, without missing her turn in the game and conversation continued without a hitch of any kind. When we finished the meal, we all knew that we had just eaten but it was like it never happened.

Millie was very good at helping folks figure out problems or situations that had them confused or upset. She didn't go looking for these conversations, but if she was drawn into them, she was quick to see the issue and what the solution was. When someone would try to run around an issue or try to convince everyone that their way was the only way, how many times did we hear Millie say, "Well I bet that went over like a poot in a space suite?" She had a way of letting you know you were just fooling yourself without telling you that you were. If a person listened to her advice and followed it, they usually came up with a pretty good solution to whatever was bothering them.

Millie tried very hard to always look like she had everything under control by being rough and gruff. However, behind all of that,

she was a sensitive and emotional person. One time, a bunch of us were at her home watching a movie. The movie got to the part where the hero won the battle and got the girl. I looked over and she was crying. Tears and mascara were running down her face and she was trying to keep her emotions quiet. When she saw me looking at her, she barked, "So what's your problem?" I told her I didn't have a problem, but now I knew all of her rough and tough was just a cover up and that she couldn't hide the fact that she had feelings like the rest of us. She glared back at me, "I got your feelings!" and said, "Maybe you do, but now I know you got them too."



That is when I saw who Millie really was. She was a problem solving, organizing, multi tasking, sensitive woman. She was a woman you couldn't say "No" to, or stop with a "Whoa" when she wanted to go. The only way to survive was to keep her running in circles so you could try to keep up with her.

I am glad to have known and been friends with Millie for forty plus years. I will miss her immensely.
