#### IT'S ONLY OPENING DAY

Crunch! Crunch! Crunch! You look around to find where the sound is coming from. There he is! That stud 10-pointer you saw last season chasin' some does in the creek bottoms. You are doin' good so far. No jitters, at least at 100 yards. He's comin' down the path you thought he would. You look at the mass and length of his tines through your binos. Now he's at 75 yards. Oh man, you thought he was 130-class buck, but now he just might break 145. He stops at the creek to get a drink. As the gigantic buck drops his head to smell the scent trail a doe left 30 minutes ago, you grab your new hunting rig you got this last summer. The same bow that you spent countless hours tuning, sighting in, and getting to know in the smoken' hot Missouri summer doldrums. The buck is now at 50 yards. Too far, and too much brush. "Be patient, breathe, don't draw until the right moment," you tell yourself. You attach your release to the D-loop. Then you count the points one last time to make sure that he has 4 points on one side. Better to be safe than sorry. As he approaches 40 yards, he stops behind the last tree before your shooting lane at 26 yards. You slowly draw your bow, making sure not to make any unnecessary noise or movement. You think to yourself, "Come on, Big Dude, just a few more steps." Almost as if the buck follows your command, he walks straight to your lane. "Perfectly broadside, keep it low and tight to the shoulder blade." At full draw, you're in the zone. But just as you start to squeeze the trigger a doe behind you winds you and blows. As she jumps the creek, you look out the corner of your eye to see the white tails, stomachs and throats of at least 6 or 7 does. You were so focused on the buck you didn't even notice the harem of does he was running with. To your surprise when you look back to the buck, he is still standing there, however, very nervous. This is the point in time when you lock up. You don't know what's going on. You throw the pin on the deer because you know he's going to bust you, but it's now a matter of when. A green smear appears in the buck's vitals, racing erratically, up and down, left and right. The next thing you remember is in slow motion. A nock and vanes escape from the bow, in a perfect arc toward the deer's heart. A sudden rush of excitement comes over you. "It's gonna get there!" You tell yourself. Then, as it seems that the arrow is 15 years from the monster buck, his belly nearly hits the ground and your arrow flies just over his back. Immediately, your stomach sinks. How did a situation go from so right, to a complete disaster? After 10 minutes of sitting in your stand in shock and trying to sort things out, you take a breath. Then, in disappointment you return to your truck. Your buddy calls you to see if you shot a big one. "No Rick, I missed Big Dude. He's a definite 10. He'll probably score 145 this year." "That's all right man," Rick said, "It's only opening day."

Summertime Blues

In the summertime, "No Hunting", blues got you, try some bowfishing, it's



a great way to cure it.

With all the flooding

through out the state waters this year there are a lot of areas to go in. All you need is to rig up and start hitting the water.

My dad introduced me to bowfishing in 1970 when I was 8 years old. I enjoy going out over the years talking to other avid people on areas, techniques and equipment, I learned to hone this skill. One of the best is Dave Williams, he knows his bowfishing.

During May and on we just walk on old levees, creek banks, sloughs, etc, shooting fish, we don't get in boats often, but we fill the buckets up. This will add to the freezer when deer-meat runs low.

In late June, Jim Shatt and I both shot really nice grassy's the larger two, Jims at 41", weighed 36 pounds; mine at 40", weighed 38 pounds. Some nice fish anywhere. We are still shooting Buffalo's a couple times a week and with luck we might be bowfishing till September 14th. So try it, introduce some kids and hit the water.

Till next time "keepum' splashin".

1 bottle Italian salad dressing


1 pound of venison steaks, tenderized

### LARGE & SMALL GAME COMMI

This is probably one of my longest and for some new members my most important article. With the bowhunting season upon us, it is fitting to explain what this committee is all about. In brief, records are kept for all the game killed by our members while hunting with archery equipment, by the rules and regs set forth by the Mo. Department of Conservation (MDC) in the state of Missouri. When one submits a game form, one could be to be awarded for his/her effort. I'll explain in this article.

The Small Game Award is presented to a member, after one accumulates thirty points for certain species of small game killed in Missouri. A point evaluation system is set for different animals. For example, raccoon, 5 points, squirrel, 4 points, etc. There is no time limit as to when the thirty points are achieved. Some hunters have accumulated the points in one season, while others have taken as long as ten years. An entry fee of \$2.00 must accompany the first application, for registration. A point system for animals taken will then be sent to that member or can be taken off our web site under Large & Small Game.

When thirty points are accumulated, that member is awarded a MBH Small Game pin. The pin, arrow-head shaped is approximately one inch in height, gold in color, with the inscription, MBH Small Game. This pin can be worn on hats, lapels or archery quiver or where ever. After one achieves the first thirty points, one can start on the next thirty at which a number "2" is awarded. The 2 is on a small chain, designed to be attached to the original Small Game pin. Number "3", is the next goal, through the number "10".

This award doesn't gets the recognition as in the past. Names and icons in our organization found in our archives are, Paul Jefferies, Earl and Ann Hoyt and Dick Wood, to name a few. There hasn't been a Small Game presentation in some three years. One of my theories with the longer bowhunting season, members are putting their efforts in taking deer and turkey rather than small game. Also, with the price of a carbon arrow and as much as \$13 broadhead, you think twice of wasting it.

The Large Game Award is set up on an annual basis. When a member takes his/her first deer or turkey in Missouri, by means of archery equipment, one receives the MBH Large Game pin. This pin is much in appearance as the Small Game except the inscription "MBH Large Game". To receive the game pin, a Large Game Report must be completed and sent to me. The report is on our web site at www.mobowhunters.org. or give me a call and I'll mail you one. I'd love to hear your success story. After one receives the Large Game Pin, the pin is designed to add an "adder bar". This can read doe, buck or turkey. There are also bars for out of state kills, such as elk, boar, antelope or bear etc. The game pin is free, the price of the adder bar is \$6.00 each.

When one receives the game form, there is a questionnaire to complete. At seasons end, the data is compiled to summarize the season.

The info seems to run parallel to the rest of the nation, i.e. the poundage of the bows is getting less. Last year the average weight was 60.1 lbs. among our members. It is no secret, the carbons have taken over the industry. Last season there were 40 reports of game killed with carbons compared to only 10 taken with aluminum. On the back side of the form, there are categories for awards, if one decides to participate.



- 1st Spring Turkey-be sure; check your watch. Deadline for your report is June 10th
- 1st Fall Turkey- again check your watch. There have been years were minutes made the difference
- 1st Deer-keep that watch handy.
- Last Deer-didn't realize how many are taken the last day, we have some real die-hards.
- Big Doe-by weight, need a verification from the meat locker and witnessed
- Big Buck-same as above
- Best Buck-an award for the largest typical and an award for largest non-typical, Pope & Young. Must be measured either by a P&Y, B& C or MABB certified scorer with a copy of such score sent to me. Green score is acceptable.
- Top Ten Doe-by weight that qualifies for the largest ten does ever taken by our members.
- Top Ten Pope & Young Typ & Non-typ-ten largest in each category taken by our members. One can submit for this award from years past, but proof of membership must be supplied at the time the animal was taken.
- 1st Deer-Youth Div. The member must be 16 years of age or younger that takes the first deer of the season.
- Lucky Deer-every member that submits a large game form with a weight on it, qualifies for this award. At the start of season, I write down a weight that is in line with what a deer might weigh. That member with the weight on or closest to that number, is awarded "Lucky Deer".

With our membership reaching an older age class and being physically challenged, I know more and more our resorting to the cross bow. Last year I opened a new award "1st Deer-Cross-bow Div." I know of at least five members using such a weapon, but only one member turned in a report for this award.

Another award not on the game form is the "Grand Slam Award". This started when the MDC changed the archery permit to two deer and two turkeys. If one filled his/her tag, they would receive that award. If a hunter would submit to this committee two fall turkey and two deer reports is all that is required. When this award was started, it was decided to open this to any bowhunter in Missouri, not just a MBH member. The idea was to generate some new members, for which it did the first couple of years. Dave Drum has a record of fourteen years straight of receiving this award.

Dave Williams, Bow Fish Chairman, and myself get together, and between what we receive from the fish and small game tournaments, we present awards for fish taken,

Longest Gar 1st & 2nd Place Biggest Common Carp 1st & 2nd Place

Biggest Asian Fish (big-head carp, grass carp, etc.) 1st & 2nd Place

Biggest Fish (Buffalo, etc.)1st & 2nd Place

Any fish taken with archery equipment, can be applied for the Small Game Award.

The deadline for Large Game Award application is Feb. 10th. That gives me about two weeks to make notifications, to get the info to the trophy shop and order the knives. At the Columbia Deer Classic, awards are presented at the MBH booth. The recipients will receive a 5x7 plaque plus a hunting knife that they would be proud to own. The exception to receiving the knife is the Grand Slam Award, since it is open to any state bow hunter.

As in any publication, pictures are always welcome. Just make sure they are presentable for viewing for a non-hunter. Wipe the blood from the animal, cover the chest cavity with leaves if needed, have your weapon in the photo and SMILE. One doesn't have to be a journalist to write about their success. Any story telling of one's harvest, I'm sure would be enjoyed by other members.

Todd Baggs (Grass Carp measured 38") and Jim Shatto of Carroll Co. have had some success as seen in this issue.

#### Scent Killer Formula

#### 2 qts Hydrogen Peroxide (3% Formula) H2O2.

You can buy this at your local grocery store. The H202 bought in the grocery stores has an additive to prolong shelf life. This additive has a slight odor which will rapidly dissipate.

You can also buy a **H202 concentrate** (27%) from swimming pool supply stores or from beauty shops. The concentrate is HIGHLY CAUSTIC. Wear rubber gloves and eye protection. Dilute the concentrate to 1 part H2O2 and 9 parts water. Pour the concentrate into the water. **Not** water into concentrate. I use the grocery store H2O2.

2 qts distilled water ½ cup of baking soda 1/8th oz of unscented soap

Mix in a large container. It takes a while for the baking soda to dissolve. Pour into an opaque (can't see thru) 1 gal container. Leave uncapped for several days to let the gases produced to vent off. Store the "big batch" in a dark place as hydrogen peroxide (H2O2) changes to water when exposed to sunlight. Fill smaller opaque bottles to use in the field.

Oh yes, you can expect a white residue after using this recipe. It's merely baking soda. I have successfully used this recipe for 15 years...maybe a tad longer.

There are all kinds of commercial formulas now that include all kinds of additives. Silver, carbon, what-They'll run about \$40 per gallon or more. This'll run about \$2 a gallon and you won't hesitate to apply it generously.

I don't care what they say. Keep the wind in your face. Use this formula at your own risk.

Good luck this year fellow bowhunters.
