Congratulations to our own MBH Lifetime Member, Dick Wood ...



.... on an outstanding showing at the **Huntsman World Senior Games** held recently in St. George, Utah! Dick currently holds the Field/3D World Record in the 65-69 year Barebow Recurve division (from 2008) as well as the American target round.

This year he chose to compete with his hunting compound bow, so he shot both events in the 65-69 Barebow Compound division. This was Dick's last year in that division for the Huntsman World Senior Games.

Dick said, "This provided me the opportunity to attempt to win titles in two different disciplines and break and set two more records!"

"The format was changed for this year's 3D, where only 2 arrows were shot at 28 targets per day with marked distances. We were forced off the range on Monday by lightening followed by more lightening and rain with only 14 official targets completed. So the scores reflect 12-10-5 scoring for only 42 targets with 2 arrows each. My competitive group chose to shoot from the sight-shooters stakes."

"I finished with only 8 shooters beating my score (all compound release) and managed to outshoot all finger shooters including those shooting Olympic style bows. I guess I was in the 'zone'. I even tied or BEAT Marlow Larson on about 5 targets on Tuesday. He



was an absolute pleasure to shoot with and at age 77, had the highest Men's score of the event. Becky Pearson was the overall Women's high scorer and she bested me by less than 40 points.

Several hurtles have to crossed before it happens, but it could be as soon as Nov. I'll keep you informed, for I might need some experienced hunters from the LOZ area to help out.

Venison Tips in Crock Pot...

2-3 lbs of venison cut into 1" cubes

1/2 cup chopped carrots

1/2 cup chopped celery

onions to taste

2 cans of cream of celery soup

1 T. Worchester Sauce

1 T.Beef bouillon granules or 2 cubes of beef bouillon

1/2 cup water

Dredge venison in flour, brown in oil, add to crock pot, after adding the rest of the ingredients

Cook on high for six hours

Use on potatoes, rice or noodles.

The Passing of a Legend in Archery

In case you hadn't been informed, sad news arrived today from the staff and P & Y, that Glenn St. Charles passed away yesterday in Seattle, at the age of 98.

Copied below are some remarks from Roger Atwood, current Pres. of P & Y and M.R. James, immediate Past Pres. of the vibrant organization that Glenn founded nearly 50 years ago.

Glenn was able to be present with us in April of '09 in Denver for the P & Y Biennial Meeting. At then age 97, he was still witty, charming, and still had that omni-present twinkle in his eye. It was fun to hear Glenn again tell the story of that famous leather fringed coat that you will remember was Glenn's favorite.

Folks...... this decade has cost us some archery giants. There is a proper way that we can honor their pioneering efforts to make our sport what it is today. Each of us could resolve to take every opportunity to make certain that those bowhunters and archers under 40 years of age know and appreciate the accomplishments of those who have gone before us. Encourage folks to research and study what remarkable accomplishments were made by these giants.



"The Pope & Young Club wishes to extend our deepest sympathy to the St. Charles family. This is also a tremendous loss for the entire bowhunting community. The Pope & Young Club lost a father figure. The bowhunting community, shaped by more than five decades of Glenn's influence, lost a guiding force," said Pope & Young Club President Roger Atwood.

A bowyer from the 1940s when modern-day hunting with the bow and arrow was still in its infancy, St. Charles became a staunch and driven advocate for the sport. His vision for bettering the image of bowhunting and proving the effectiveness of the bow and arrow...the very creation of the Pope and Young Club...was integral in the establishment of bowhunting seasons and the acceptance and popularity that bowhunting has since garnered. His work as Hunting Activities Chairman of the National Field Archery Association in the 1950s led to the development of the bowhunting records program, the subsequent founding of the Pope and Young Club in 1961, and the creation of a bowhunting ethical code and Rules of Fair Chase. His efforts and devotion to the cause of bowhunting spanned over eight decades. A legitimate iconic figure, St. Charles was one of the last true bowhunting pioneers.

M. R. James, President of the Archery Hall of Fame, and Past President of the Pope and Young Club, added "Glenn St. Charles will be remembered by many as a talented bowyer and founder of the Pope and Young Club. Rightfully so. But for his close friends and family, he will be fondly recalled a man who accomplished much more during a long and active lifetime. Father and father figure; fierce advocate and tireless defender of the sport he loved; pioneer bowhunter and visionary leader; outspoken conservationist; promoter of fair chase hunting; loyal friend and wise mentor; without question, Glenn St. Charles left his indelible mark on archery and bowhunting. He will be missed, but his place in our sport's rich history is secure."

SEARCH FOR 2010 PAUL JEFFRIES MBH SCHOLARSHIP WINNER!

If you are a current MBH member and have been for at least one year, you may be eligible to win a Scholarship Award through the Paul Jeffries MBH Scholarship program. Since the inception of this program in 2003, several MHB members have received recognition and financial assistance.

Even though the program is named after one of MBH's two founders; Paul Jeffries and Earl Hoyt, it is important to realize that funds have been donated to honor and serve as a memorial for several other Life Members; Ann Hoyt, Gene Towne and Dr. Charles (Bert) Grayson, who was awarded an Honorary Life Membership.

The focus of this program is to provide financial assistance to a worthy MBH member who is currently attending or planning on enrolling in a school of higher learning.

Although not written in stone, it is expected that you would be meeting the definition of the school, in regard to "full time student". Typically this is 12 or more credit hours per semester. A "school of higher learning" does not necessarily mean just a college or university, but could include a "tech" or other specialty school.

The scholarship amount will be applied to the student's individual institutional account to be used to help with expenses. The goal and purpose of this scholarship program is as follows:

To provide a program that will permanently honor and recognize contributions made by MBH co-founder Paul Jeffries, as well as other outstanding individuals who have contributed to the sport of archery.

To promote archery and bow hunting as well as to encourage others to hold membership in Missouri Bow Hunters.

To recognize a new generation of leadership by awarding scholarships to assist these future leaders in their pursuit of higher education.

To encourage positive ambassadorship for the sport of archery and the Missouri Bow Hunters Association

ADMINISTRATION OF THE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

The committee serves at the pleasure of the current MBH President and he/she shall appoint no more than three MBH members to serve in addition to the President. A fifth committee appointment may be made, with that member being a member of Paul Jeffries family.

This committee shall convene for the purpose of reviewing scholarship applications for awards no more frequently than annually. The committee shall not be required to award any scholarships if (in their opinion) the applicants do not meet the committee's standards. The committee, being stewards of the funds, shall also decide the amount(s) of awards. Typically the committee, in the interest of keeping the funds endowed, will consider limiting the awards to no more than the previous period's earnings including donations raised by MBH clubs through special fundraisers or individual memorials/honors. Total annual awards do not typically exceed \$500.

It is expected by the committee that the applicant has been a MBH member in good standing for a minimum of one year prior to the application. The MBH Secretary will be asked to verify such membership.

Due to the current financial climate, the future of this program is critically dependent on donations. It is altogether fitting and proper for MBH Clubs and individual members to keep this MBH program in mind as a means for honoring those who have contributed to the sport of Archery. The Scholarship Committee is now accepting applications for this distinct honor. All applications must be postmarked or electronically submitted to the MBH Secretary no later than November $26^{\rm th}, 2010$

The Scholarship Committee will convene and make their decisions after reviewing all applications. All application content will be kept strictly confidential.
