7 miles, we have approximately 50+ members. The Missouri Conservation built us a new 30'X30' pavilion this year, we are told by those that come and shoot we have a great range. We take pride in how well we maintain it is. It takes a lot of mowing throughout the year by; Vernie, Roger Dobias, and myself.

We started the year with kids archery lessons at our local archery shop in early January and ran through mid March. Our archery club bought Genesis and regular bows along with the Mini Genesis, both right and left handed, so we could handle what the kids needed. We worked with them one night a week. There were as many as 20 at a session. One of our kids had MS. It was such a joy to watch as she shot the first arrow and hit the target, she let out the biggest giggle you ever heard.

We hosted a YMCA day camp for the kids K thru 5th grade, a lot of fun for the kids and us.

Our 3-D shoots started late March we shoot

the 4th week-end March thru August.

We averaged between 125 attendees, our last one on March 22nd we had 189 participants.

Our Traditional Shoot is March thru August.

In May our club assisted with the Kids Fishing Day at Roaring River at Cassville. We will have several hundred kids come through the archery part of it. We have 3 Field Shoots every year they are in May, June, and July, unfortunately as other field shoot. We anticipate a better draw in the future. Roger Dobias puts a lot of effort into this shoot.

In October our archery club will be at Barnyard Days, with bows for the kids to shoot. This will be our 4th year, last year we had approximately 350 kids attend and visit our booth in 3 days. A busy week-end, but it is a lot of fun and very rewarding.



SMALL GAME COMMITTEE

While some members already have filled at least one of their deer/turkey permits by the time one reads this article, I doubt that I'll have any reports

to publish. But since this is bowhunting season, I feel an article is in order.

This will be brief, for as many of you know, I'd rather bow hunt than write hunting articles.

In today's deer hunting world, trophy hunting has taken the lime light. There isn't a hunting magazine that one reads that doesn't have an article on food plots, Quality Deer Management (QDM) or how to harvest that buck of a life time.

For the novice bow hunter, one might not know how Missouri stands in the ranking. Much has been written on Kansas, Iowa and Illinois for trophy bucks, but don't cut Missouri short. In Brad Herndon book "Mapping Trophy Bucks", he stated Missouri ranks #6 for the number of Boone & Crocket (B&C) bucks and #8 for the number of Pope & Young (P&Y) bucks.

In his publication, he listed the top trophy counties in Mo. #1 Boone Co., #2 St. Louis Co. .#3 Jackson Co., #4 Putnam Co. ,#5 Macon Co. Since the copy write was 2003, I might question how these counties currently rank, but it is interesting to observe that the top three counties at that time also had urban hunts.

As the listing goes, Randy Simonitch has the #2 ranking Non-typical P&Y 33pt. 269 7/8 taken in Pike Co. in 2000. In Herndon's publication, he stated that Mo. had 36 bucks that qualified for P&Y non-type over 170. Since this publication is several years old, I checked with the listings in Archery Big Bucks of Missouri (ABBM) and discovered that there were 71 over 170 and 19 over 190 P&Y.

Arron McCauley has the #1 P&Y Typ in Mo. with a 10 pointer at 191 4/8 taken in St. Louis Co. in 1999. I remember talking to Arron at the Columbia Deer Classic in 2000. He stated he had a small tract, less than 20 acres in west St. Louis Co., to hunt on. What was interesting was, that he stated from his tree stand he could watch people walk in and out of Dillard's Department Store at the shopping mall. According to ABBM, there are 23 P&Y Typ over 170. Not a bad indication of what can be taken.

In 2007, in my home county of Camden, there was a 223" B&C non-typ, gross score, killed in early Oct. by a hunter, John Shelton, using a cross bow. I only mention this because it was killed, by the crow flies, 1/4 mile from my house. Never know where these trophies will show.

After working the Saturday Columbia Deer Classic, it has been customary for a gathering to relax, enjoy a good meal and sprits at a local eating establishment. There could be as few as twelve or as many as thirty. I mention this only because it gives me a chance to talk to any bow hunter's good friend and President of ARRM, Don Roper and his wife Claudette. Don might be considered by some as the Grand-father of Bow Hunting Education in Missouri. For he was teaching this course on his own long before the Mo. of Conservation (MDC) got involved. Don is also a B&C and P&Y official scorer. When a potential world record is to be scored, Don is on the panel to be one of the judges. Bottom line, he knows his bucks! At the last gathering, he was telling me how five years ago, if a 150 class was brought thru the doors, heads would turn. Not any more, he stated that there are many in the 170-180 class on a regular basis. And if someone thinks the point restriction isn't working, have him/ her talk to me. As always it is a joy to talk with Don.

So with all that being said, it will be interesting to see how MO will rank in future years. As for me, I hunt the trophy bucks during the rut, but I enjoy the good lean meat of those does.

If you have a tract of land with only two doe fawns, two yearling does, and adult does and every doe is bred yearly, five years later you would have almost 100 deer on your property! This is without any hunting or natural deaths occurring. Source: Whitetail News, Vol 20 - Just thought you'd like to know, Til next month,

PHOTOGRAPHY TUPS, by Terry Whitford

- We all like to take photos at "Once in a lifetime events". Here are some tips to ensure that your photos are as good as possible.
- 1. If you are the "official" photographer for an awards event announce before the event that you want everyone that receives an award or prize to face the photographer (you) for at least 2 photos. Many times we see a photo of the back of the award recipient.
- 2. Shutter speed setting should be at least 1/100 second.
- 3. If it's a sunny day set your camera to FORCE the flash to fire (if possible) to lighten shadows. However not effective on large groups.
- 4. Keep distracting elements out of the background. If you have to move recipients to another location you will appreciate the extra seconds spent.
- 5. ISO settings should be 400 or less.
- 6. Have your subjects be the same or similar distance from the camera.
- 7. Take 2 photos of everything.
- 8. Have extra batteries on hand.

Before the event starts take some "practice" photos to ensure the best possible results. An extra 5 minutes spent will result in better photos and reduce your stress level.

"Hero" trophy bow hunting photos.

- 1. Sunny day? Force the flash to fire.
- 2. Take photos both forcing the flash to fire and not fire.
- 3. Cloudy day? Force the flash to fire.
- 4. Take photos both forcing the flash to fire and not fire.
- 5. Clean excess blood from trophy.
- 6. Put tongue back in mouth.
- 7. Tuck legs under trophy.
- 8. Check for small weeds/branches/etc between the camera and the trophy. These small items will be very bright when using flash and also very distracting as they will probably be out of focus also.
- 9. Do not "sit" on your animal.
- 10. Isolate the antlers against a non distracting background. The sky is perfect.
- 11. Photos should be taken in the trophy's natural element. No photos in the back of the truck!!!
- 12. Smile

Take your time. You may never get another trophy like this.
