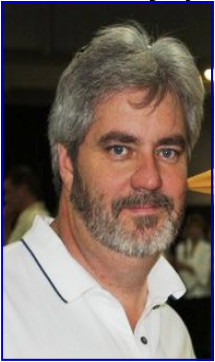

News from EAST Fork Archery...

After many months of preparation, construction, waiting and then more construction... the doors at East Fork Archery (EFA) are finally open! EFA is owned and managed by Richard and Kathy Potter and is located northwest of Moberly at 1401 County Road 1255, Huntsville, MO. It is a registered commercial shooting facility for both MBH and NFAA.

So what is EFA? East Fork Archery is a facility dedicated to the advancement of the sport of archery. The goal is to provide leagues, lessons and tournament opportunities to help grow archery skills for Shooters of all ages and disciplines. The range provides ten lanes for shooting on new Block range targets. Shooters also have WiFi and Satellite TV at their disposal.

On October 29th, EFA hosted their 1st tournament. Fifty shooters attended from MBH clubs across the state and a few Shooters even came from Iowa and Indiana. Over \$750 in prize money was paid back and trophies were provided for ALL Youth Shooters.

Monday night 7pm league has just kicked off and will continue throughout the winter months. Tuesdays are devoted to providing monitored practice for Youth and Adults who want assistance to develop and grow their shooting skills.

4. Jeff Blystone, Independence, 84 lb. doe, 23 yard shot, killed on Oct. 19th at 6:40 pm in Platte Co. #18
5. Jack Davis, Camden, 68 lb. doe, 22 yard shot, taken in Camden Co. on Oct. 20th at 8:10 am. #50. The little ones are a harder target!
6. Jack Davis, 92 lb. doe, 20 yard shot, killed Nov. 1st at 7:25 am in Camden Co. Nice way to start Nov.!

Although the antler growing season last for nearly five months, the bulk of the growing occurs during a four week span in mid-summer. Adult bucks begin growing their antlers around the last week of March. Over the next 4 1/2 months they can grow 150 to 200 inches of antler. The greatest antler growth occurs between June 15th and July 15th. Source: Deer and Deer Hunting.

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND OF MISSOURI BOW HUNTERS ASSOCIATION

Interest in field archery was in the process of development in the 1940's in Missouri. Small target archery clubs over the state were building interest and selling the idea of field archery and hunting to its members who desired more action than just target shooting.

The leading target archers were also the leading field archers in the beginning. They met with officials of the Missouri Conservation Commission and favorably impressed them with increased interest in hunting deer with bow and arrow. This action and many personal contacts won the First Missouri Archery Deer Season.

Deer hunting was permitted for the first time in the gun season of 1945. Paul Jeffries and Earl Hoyt, Jr. were instrumental in convincing the MO Department of Conservation to establish the first archery deer season in Crawford County in October of 1946. At that time Paul and Earl already had the concept of Missouri Bow Hunters well designed. Our two co-founders used the forum of the first hunt for Paul to announce, while fittingly standing on a stump, to the 73 pioneer archers in attendance that a statewide committee was being formed. It took several months to do this, but it finally came together at the first Annual Championship Tourney, which was held on the public golf course at Sedalia, Missouri under the able guidance of Hugh Collins and a few of his local archers. A business meeting was held in conjunction with the tourney and the Missouri Bow Hunters emerged a small, but very energetic new State Association. These early pioneers worked tirelessly for longer and better hunting territory for the archery deer season, more work in getting help to local clubs wanting to get organized, rebuilding clubs and club ranges and constantly looking for more space. Look around you today and see some of the many benefits you gain by being a member of the Missouri Bow Hunters Association.

Missouri Bow Hunters bestowed its highest honor on Earl Hoyt, Jr. and Paul Jeffries by inducting them into the MBH Hall of Fame. Two other highly distinguished and incredibly worthy archery legends, Ann Webber Hoyt and Gene Towne also have been enshrined in the MBH Hall of Fame.

Conservation Committee

This month let's talk about trapping. Yah I know, this is a bow hunting organization but by knowing how to trap you can improve your bow hunting. If you are getting more trail cam pictures of raccoons, opossums, foxes, coyotes, & bobcats over deer and turkeys then you need to learn how to trap! Coyotes & bobcats will take deer fawns at every opportunity and all of the critters will destroy a turkey nest to get the eggs. Through trapping you can reduce the number of predators which should increase your deer & turkey population. Another benefit of trapping is that it forces you to be very observant. You must learn how to read the sign left by the furbearer so that you know where to place the trap in turn that will teach you to read deer & turkey sign better. Like any other thing in life there is a learning curve to becoming a good trapper. The best way I know of to learn about trapping is to join the Missouri Trapper Association. The MTA has been around since 1958 and is split into 9 districts throughout the state. Each district has an annual trapping clinic to teach trapping to anyone who is willing to spend a couple of days learning. The MTA also holds annual fur auctions where you can sell the fur you have caught. With your membership to MTA you can choose to include a subscription to Trapper & Predator Caller Magazine which comes 10 times a year and is a great how-to resource about trapping. The MTA is also an affiliate to the Conservation Federation of Missouri just like MBH. Another great resource for learning how to trap is the Missouri Department of Conservation. The MDC realizes that trapping is an important management tool and promotes trapping through its website and with training classes as well. A resident trapping license is only 10 dollars and there is no limit to the amount of furbearers you can catch during the season. The general trapping season opens on November 15th and closes January 31st. You can visit these websites for more info, <http://missouritrappersassociation.org/> and <http://www.mdc.mo.gov/hunting-trapping/trapping>.

Hunting season update, I harvested a doe on 10/19/11 with a 23 yd shot in Platte County. I get just as excited if not more so than I did when I got my first archery harvest back in 1981. That evening was especially windy and I thought I was wasting my time but 15 minutes before dark I got the opportunity. Just goes to show if you sit in a deer stand instead of the recliner at home you will get your chance.
