

LARGE & SMALL GAME COMMITTEE

Here they are! Missouri Bowhunter Association's Top 2 Deer Kills!

MBH All Time P&Y Typical Bucks'.

The #2 buck was killed on the evening of November 10th 1997 by Marcus Milligan in Bates County. The 220 pound 10pt giant scored 173&2/8 P&Y. The G2's on that deer measured 13&1/2 on the right and 14 inches on the left. The G3's were 12 and 11 inches! The antler bases were 5+ inches! The very symmetrical rack only had 4&2/8 inches of deductions. Marcus shot that deer from a blind at a distance of 30 yards. A 65lb Martin compound bow paired with aluminum arrow and Satellite broadhead through the ribcage brought him down within 150 yards after the shot.

The All Time #1 MBH Buck was harvested by Jim Holdenried on November 11, 1982. The 11pt monster scored 173&7/8 P&Y! Jim shot that buck at 4:05pm on state owned land in Pike County. Jim also used a Satellite broadhead and an aluminum arrow from his Hoyt 66lb compound bow. A tree stand shot of 20 yards while the deer was running by caused the demise of the 180lb buck. The G2's on this buck measured in at 14 plus inches and the G3's were 10&6/8 on the right, 12&6/8 on the left. This buck had slightly smaller mass measurements than the #2 buck but made up for it in main beam and tine length to become #1!

MBH All Time P&Y Non-Typical Bucks'.

The only record I can find of the #2 all time non-typical is a one line sentence telling me that Dave Reid killed a buck that scored 188&6/8 in Adair County back in 1991. I wish I could find out more about that deer. So if anyone knows Dave's story please past it on to me so I can give Dave & his deer the proper recognition.

According to the records that were passed on to me the MBH #1 All Time Non-Typical was taken at 3pm on November 14, 1982 by Dennis Jones. The 21pt buck scored a whopping 194&7/8 P&Y. Dennis shot that deer from a treestand in Warren County at 5 yards with his 57lb PSE Lazer Mag compound launching an aluminum arrow with a Wasp broadhead. The mainframe 8 had long beams and tines with sticker points everywhere.

MBH All Time Big Does'.

The # 2 Doe was taken on State land in Livingston County by Jerry Decker at 7:00am on November 6, 1986. The big doe's field dress weight was 170lbs! Jerry was in a treestand with his 54lb.York compound bow and made a 17 yard shot. The Thunderhead broadhead on an aluminum arrow did the job.

Accomplished big doe killer Brian Jones tops the big doe list with his second entry into the top ten list. In Clinton County Brian arrowed a huge doe that was weighed on the scales of the Robison Elevator Company in Lathrop, Mo. at 180 pounds! Brian used an XI Legend compound bow set at 65lbs with Easton 2314 arrows and a Satellite broadhead to kill the doe from a treestand at 20 yards on December 22, 1996. They sure grow them big in Clinton County! Congratulations to all of the bowhunters on the All Time List!

Over the last 5 months we have counted down the MBH Top Ten Deer and I am looking forward to seeing more big deer reports to come in this season. Remember you don't have to make the top ten list to get an award. Each season MBH gives awards to the biggest deer killed for that season so be sure to send in your large game reports. You can find an official Pope & Young scorer by looking at the Archery Big Bucks of Missouri website at www.archerybigbucks.com and clicking on Official Scorers. They are listed by county with their phone numbers. You can also find one at www. pope-young.org under the Records Program tab. Also remember that starting this season MBH will be giving a newly designed Large Game Pin to anyone that completes a Large Game Report. Fill it out online at the MBH website under the Game Awards tab or send one to me by mail and I will send you you're new pin. Please include a picture of you're harvest if you can, I really like seeing those photos and it may get published in the newsletter. Happy Bow Hunting

fieldarchery.org. The deadline is December 31st, 2012. Winners will be announced at the Vegas Shoot in February.


